## Mano cabinet expansion before Aug 15

### Fadnavis To Get Home Portfolio

New Delhi: Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde is likely to expand his cabinet this week by inducting at least 15 ministers and deputy chief minister Deendra Fadnavis is expected to keep the crucial Home portfolio, sources said on Sunday. Top government sources also said the civic works in the state delayed due to the OBC reservation issue being heard by the Supreme Court, are likely to be held in October after getting a clarification from the court.

Shinde and Fadnavis were sworn in as chief minister and deputy chief minister respectively on June 30 for the resignation of former Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray's cabinet in the Shiv Sena ranks. The duo have been functioning as a two-member cabinet since then. The expansion of the Maharashtra cabinet will take place "before you can even imagine it", Fadnavis said in response to repeated questions from reporters. Sources said the exercise

will be carried out before August 15. On Saturday, chief minister Shinde said the functioning of the state government has not been affected in any way due to the delay in the expansion of the council of ministers and that many ministers will be inducted soon. "The work of the government has not been affected in any way. The decision making process has not been affected. I and the deputy chief minister have been taking decisions and there is no impact on the working of the government," the chief minister said. Fadnavis said the BJP has embarked on a mission to improve its footprint in Maharashtra in the 2024 Lok Sabha election. It will contest 100 constituencies, constituencies where opposition parties have had a consistent winning streak. He said these constituencies included those held by Shiv Sena leaders who have now joined the Shinde camp.

### Former Latur district Sena chief joins Shinde faction

Latur: Former Latur district chief of the Shiv Sena Balwant Jadhav on Sunday said he was joining the faction of the party led by Maharashtra chief minister Eknath Shinde. Jadhav said this respect for Uddhav Thackeray had now diminished at all but he was joining the Shinde faction due to the insipid leadership of former Aurangabad Lok Sabha MP Chandrakant Khaire. "I am unhappy with the leadership of Khaire. He tried to diminish the Sena in Latur. My love and respect for Uddhav Thackeray will always remain. Eknath Shinde has taken steps to boost the strength of the Sena," Jadhav said. He said he would have allied with parties like the Nationalist Congress Party and the Congress as this is a rejection of the thoughts and ideals of party founder Balasaheb Thackeray, he claimed.

## Stage set for Shah's maiden Odisha visit after becoming home minister

Bhubaneswar: Preparations are in full swing in Odisha to welcome home minister Amit Shah who will reach Bhubaneswar on Sunday night. The twin cities of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack are bedecked with posters, banners and placards of Shah, who will visit the state for the first time after becoming the home minister. Shah's programmes will start with a visit to the Lingaraj Temple in Bhubaneswar on the last Monday of 'Shravana'.

## Baghel seeks extension of GST compensation for 5 yrs at NITI meet

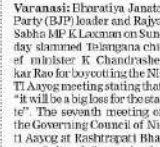


New Delhi: Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Sunday reiterated his demand to the Centre seeking a five-year extension for the compensation paid to states for revenue short-fall due to GST implementation and called for revising the rates of royalties for coal and other major minerals from the state.

Addressing the meeting of the seventh Governing Council of NITI Aayog chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Baghel said the state's demand of GST compensation, transferring of the amount to a special fund, a 10% levy from coal block companies and reimbursement of expenditure of Rs 11,329 crore made by the state government for re-occupation of Naxalists.

There has been a loss of revenue to states due to the GST system and the Centre has not made arrangements to compensate the loss of revenue of about Rs 6,000 crore to the state in the coming year, he said. The GST compensation should be continued for the next five years after June 2022, the chief minister was noted as saying in a statement.

## BJP slams T'gana CM KCR for boycotting NITI Aayog meet



Varanasi: Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader and Rajya Sabha MP K. Chandrababu Naidu slammed T'gana chief minister K. Chandrababu Naidu for boycotting the NITI Aayog meeting stating that "it will be a big loss for the state". The seventh meeting of the Governing Council of NITI Aayog at Keshavnagar Bhawan Cultural Centre in the national capital is underway. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is chairing the meeting. The meeting is the first to be held since the Governing Council since July 2019. KCR said he will boycott the meeting saying he doesn't find it useful to attend the meeting and that the BJP of Telangana are fed up with the TRS government and they think that BJP is the only alternative for Telangana. Responding to KCR's statement, the BJP MP Naidu said, "This is most unfortunate politics as it has nothing to do with NITI Aayog. Boycotting the meeting will not cause loss to him or his family but it is a big loss for the state." He further said that being a chief minister, KCR should attend meetings to discuss and raise issues related to the state.

"NITI Aayog was formed so that chief ministers can discuss issues, can give their advice and ask questions from the government. Now you are not attending the meeting. KCR should come to the meeting and discuss whatever KCR had said in front of media," said BJP MP.

## Ahead of Guj polls, Kejriwal promises sops for tribals

Vadodra: Aam Aadmi Party national convener Arvind Kejriwal on Sunday promised implementation of the Constitution of India's Fifth Schedule and the Panchayat (Extension to Scheduled Areas) Act in tribal regions of Gujarat if the AAP is voted to power in the state.

Kejriwal also promised that Gujarat's tribal advisory committee would be headed by a person from the community instead of the chief minister, as has been the case in the past. He said the Gujarat Assembly elections due later this year, will be a direct contest between the ruling BJP and the AAP. Kejriwal also said that if AAP comes to power in Gujarat, each tribal village will get a good government school and a "mudhala clinic". Multi-specialty hospitals will also be set up in these regions for the treatment of tribals, the Delhi chief minister said. He also promised simplification of the caste certificate issuance process and houses to those who do not own one. The governments will also connect tribal villages with roads, he said.

## Spicejet flyers walk on Delhi airport's tarmac after waiting for bus for 45 min



New Delhi: A significant number of passengers who disembarked from Spicejet's Hyderabad-Delhi flight on Sunday night walked on the airport's tarmac as the airline could not provide a bus for around 45 minutes to take them to the terminal, sources said. An Indian regulator DGCA is investigating the incident, sources said.

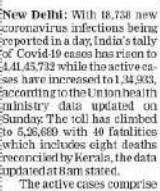
Spicejet, however, said there was a brief delay in the arrival of coaches, and once the buses came, all the passengers, including those who had started walking, travelled on them from the tarmac in the terminal building. Spicejet repeated requests from

Passengers were not allowed to walk on the Delhi airport's tarmac areas as it is a security risk. There is a demarcated path on the tarmac for vehicles only. Therefore, the airlines use buses to take passengers from terminal to aircraft or vice versa using the demarcated path. Currently, Spicejet is operating not more than 80% of its flights as per the orders of the Director General of Civil Aviation (DGCA).

The regulator had in July imposed the curb on the airline's flights for a period of eight weeks as its planes were involved in at least eight incidents of technical malfunction.

in the June 18-July 5 period. Spicejet's Hyderabad-Delhi flight - which had 186 passengers - was delayed at its destination at around 11.24 PM on Saturday, sources said. One bus came immediately and took a section of the passengers to the terminal 3, they said. The rest of the passengers waited for about 45 minutes, and as they didn't see any bus coming for them, they started walking towards the terminal which was about 1.5 km away, they noted. After these passengers walked for around 11 minutes on tarmac, a bus came at around 12.20 PM to take them to the terminal, they said.

## Govt: Active Covid-19 cases in country increase to 1,34,933



New Delhi: With 18,728 new coronavirus infections being reported in a day, India's tally of active Covid-19 cases has risen to 1,34,933 while the active cases have increased to 1,34,933, according to the Union Health Ministry data updated on Sunday. The toll has climbed to 5,26,680 with 40 fatalities in the terminal building, as reported by Kerala, the data recorded at Ram stated.

The active cases comprise 0.31% of the total infections, while recovery rate was recorded at 95%, and the weekly positivity rate at 46%, according to the ministry. The number of people who have recuperated from Covid-19 has surged to 4,38,84,111, while the case fatality rate was recorded at 1.16%. According to the ministry, 206.21 crore doses of Covid vaccine have been administered

in the country so far under the nationwide vaccination drive. India's tally had crossed the 50 lakh mark on August 7, 2021. On August 23, 10 lakh in September and 15 lakh on September 16. It went past 60 lakh on September 28, 10 lakh on October 10, crossed 60 lakh on October 25, 10 lakh on November 20 and passed the one crore mark on December 8. The next fatalities include nine from Maharashtra, four each from Chhattisgarh and West Bengal, three from Manipur, two from Madhya Pradesh and one each from Bihar, Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Meghalaya, Odisha, Punjab and Tripura.

## Dhankhar meets outgoing V-P Naidu
